Summary

- DTMG objectives and outcomes include the removal of as much impervious surface as possible and the construction of a permeable pavement GI Grant SCM to capture stormwater runoff from remaining and new impervious areas.
- DTMG is located adjacent to the Cleveland Foundation headquarters building and the proposed GI Grant Project will directly connect to an existing NEORSD-funded project on the north side of the Foundation parcel.
- DTMG will install the same permeable pavement system components and connect directly to their vehicular entry court.
- The project site is adjacent to our recently completed Phase 1 improvements funded by NEORSD's GI Grant Program.
- The 7.5-acre area surrounded by Euclid/Chester/E66 and E69 streets will continue to evolve as one of the 'greenest' blocks in the city.
