Summary:

The Bass Lake II project purchased a 195-acre property which permanently protects critical water resources within the Upper Main Branch of the Chagrin River. The property lies immediately west of Bass Lake and contains 10.2 acres of Category 3 wetlands and another 5.3 acres of Category 2 wetlands. The property also contains 1,250 linear feet of the mainstem of the Chagrin River and another 13,700 linear feet of headwater and primary headwater habitat streams. Significantly, much of the streams onsite flow into the State's last remaining native brook trout stream which, maintains Northeast Ohio's native biodiversity.

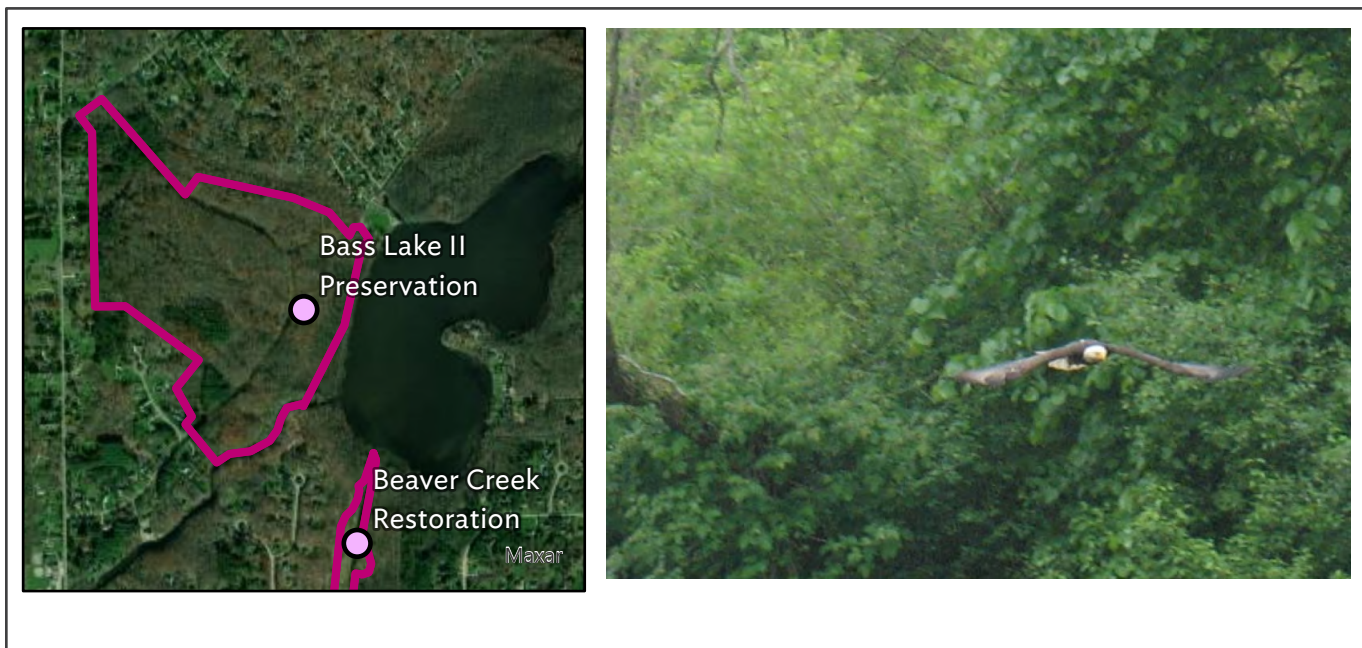
