Summary:

This is a valuable long-term water resource protection project, consists of a 435-acre tract, which is located in the headwaters of the Brandywine Creek watershed, a tributary of the Cuyahoga River. Approximately 365 acres of the property can be classified as mature forest or woody wetland, including 95 acres of high-quality wetlands and 19,800 linear feet of headwater streams that drain to the Cuyahoga River including 160 feet of the main stem of Brandywine Creek. Ten percent of the wetlands within the Brandywine Creek watershed are found on this property. Two state listed plant species, the Great Plains Lady's Tresses and the Fringed Gentian were identified on site.
