Summary:

The Floyd Preserve – Etoll/Lowzinski tracts project involved the acquisition of ~31-acres, including the preservation/restoration of 13-acres of Category 3 wetlands. The acquisition of these tracts preserves the State-endangered Striped Maple, in addition to the habitat for five documented species of salamander. The preservation of these tracts will also conserve ~1,450 feet of stream frontage on Bear Creek, as well as 450 feet of frontage on an un-named tributary of Conneaut Creek, which are home to the Globally-vulnerable species of Redside Dace. It is important to note that this project builds upon previous conservation efforts by the Cleveland Museum of Natural History to protect land along the Bear Creek tributary of Conneaut Creek.
