Summary:

This project involved the acquisition of the 101-acre Boehm parcel, which has been incorporated into the Grand River Terraces Preserve. The Boehm parcel includes 9 acres of floodplain meadow, 9 acres of floodplain terrace/slopes, 3,081 linear feet of the State Scenic Grand River, 1,120 feet of Exceptional Warm Water Habitat along Trumbull Creek, and 3,021 feet of tributary streams and 1.01 acres of palustrine emergent and forested Category 3 wetlands. This acquisition has resulted in the creation of a 4.25-mile protected stream corridor and protects one of the best freshwater mussel beds on the State Wild & Scenic Grand River and one of the best populations of the globally vulnerable and Ohio Species of Concern eastern sand darter in Ohio.
