Summary:

The Spring Hill Wetlands project permanently protects 153 acres containing critical water resources within the high headwaters of the Aurora Branch of the Chagrin River. This tract contains over 65 acres of Category Ill scrub/shrub and forested wetland habitat, ~2,000 lineal feet of the main stem of the Aurora Branch - Chagrin River at its source waters, and ~2,200 feet of primary headwater habitat tributary streams to the Aurora Branch. The stream and wetland resources are surrounded by a well-developed forest canopy of mature upland woods comprised primarily of eastern hardwoods. The large size and exceptional quality of the scrub/shrub and forested wetlands make it an ideal habitat for amphibian breeding, and plant and animal diversity.


